# Nature Fresh Farms Comes to the Rescue



The Downtown Mission's Rev. Ron Dunn paid a visit to Nature Fresh Farms in Leamington in late October, to express the Mission's appreciation and recognize the company for rescuing the Mission's FRESH Program in 2020. Nature Fresh Farms' sister company, South Essex Fabricating, was also recognized for their support.

The Mission's FRESH Program, is a Food Rescue Service, picking up healthy food from green houses, grocery stores and food wholesalers which would otherwise go to waste. The food is sorted, packaged and redistributed to over 64 schools and agencies which provide food security to individuals and families in our community.

In late 2019, the FRESH Program was in danger of ending due to a funding shortfall. Nature Fresh Farms saw the need and valuable role this program plays in feeding hungry people in our community, and stepped forward with a major gift to keep the program going. In addition to funding this program, Nature Fresh Farms has donated 67,212 pounds of produce to the Mission as well. Last year, the amount of food rescued through this program totaled 1,580,836 pounds.

In a surprise announcement during the presentation, Peter Quiring, President and CEO of Nature Fresh Farms announced that the company would once again step up and provide the support needed for this vital program to continue in 2021. "Everybody is looking to somebody else to do the right thing or to help out, be of service. But we shouldn't be looking at everybody else, we should be looking at ourselves. The Mission feeds hundreds of people a day, that's an entire village in a lot of places, and that's pretty significant", said Mr. Quiring.

Nature Fresh Farms is a leadingedge South Essex based agricultural growing operation. The company's services include; logistics, crop work, sales, production, and bio control. The company provides safe, healthy, sustainably-grown food to people across the globe. The Downtown Mission was pleased to receive the support of the United Way/Centraide Windsor-Essex and the Government of Canada this Summer to allow for enhanced support being made available to the young people who come to the Windsor Youth Centre despite the pandemic. This much-needed financial support, secured through to the end of March 2021, allows our Youth Services Team to engage one-onone and safely with youth to help them navigate life through the rapid changes in our community. Over the past few months, this funding has allowed approximately 50 young people who are living precariously or experiencing homelessness in our community, to not feel isolated. It has given them hope for tomorrow and has shown them that the Downtown Mission and our larger community is there for them. In some cases with their young children, during these complicated times when vital services are difficult to access, young people have had a place to go for help and support.

Increasing the positive impacts on our youth is the outreach efforts of our Youth Services Team, made possible through the Solcz Family Foundation. This "lifeline" of compassion and service has enabled our Team to reach hundreds of youth over the past few months, in new and innovative ways, to ensure they don't reach a state of isolation or hopelessness. During a period of much uncertainty and

fear for so many of us, young people with precarious living situations or experiencing homelessness have had to deal with finding help for the very basic needs of food and shelter. They have been able to find these necessities, compassion and so much more at the Windsor Youth Centre!

With the support of these caring community partners, the Windsor Youth Centre Team has been able to continue to connect with our vulnerable young people to ensure they don't feel abandoned and are safe through these most challenging of times. Executive Director, Rev. Ron Dunn is proud of the work being done by the Windsor Youth Centre and grateful for the support of these invaluable community partners and our generous community supporters as well. "The youth we serve have been telling us they do not know where to turn to for assistance, who is open, what new programs exist and how to access the available programs they need. For those who are housed, they feel the impact of isolation, for those who are still living on the streets, it is hard to focus priorities and live life when you don't have a place to call home. Vulnerable young people need some help navigating life right now. It's a big unknown for us all, but our young people should not feel alone in this! We are grateful for our partners, the Government of Canada and our local United Way/Centraide Windsor-Essex County as well as the Solcz Family Foundation for their help in ensuring no young person or young family feels alone or hopeless. We are grateful for these valuable partners who stepped up to ensure the Mission's Youth Services Team could be there for these young people during this very difficult time. With the support of our caring community, we look forward to



supporting these young people through the coming year ahead, to give them the tools they need to move forward in their lives to a place of secure living and mental and emotional well-being", said Rev. Dunn.
