## Changes at the Downtown Mission - Our New Normal

After a year of uncertainty, fear and change during the last 9 months of 2020, the first 3 months of 2021 has brought even more changes and uncertainty, our faith and character have been tested time and time again, but the Downtown Mission stands strong with your help, support and prayers! For all that we have been blessed with, we are truly grateful!!! Since mid-March 2020, the Mission's Non-Essential Services were put on pause or taken to a virtual format where possible and our Staff and Volunteers were trained to provide all Essential Services safely and in new ways as required. All this was done with much consultation and support from the City of Windsor and the Windsor-Community Essex Health However, due to the recent COVID Outbreak at the Downtown Mission in February 2021, where several Guests, Staff and Volunteers tested positive, our Dining Hall at 664 Victoria Ave and our Shelter at 875 Ouellette Ave (sites of the Outbreak) were temporarily closed on Monday, Feb. 15th until a safe plan to reopen them was determined. During that time, the Mission worked out an agreement with the owner of 850 Quellette to shelter and feed Guests who weren't COVID Positive while we worked on our plan to reopen our other 2 locations. Other Programs not affected by the Outbreak continued and our Service Staff were sent to 850 Ouellette to provide our Essential Services there. Shortly thereafter, the City of Windsor and Community Partners, decided to open a Temporary Emergency Shelter at the Aquatic Centre (TESAC), to keep those individuals needing shelter/food safe. Anyone who tested positive at the Temporary Shelter would be taken to the City's Isolation and Recovery Centre (IRC), as they had been doing for anyone testing positive with no place to isolate in.

However, this Temporary Shelter did cause a gap in service for individuals seeking shelter and food, after it was opened (March 5th). As was documented by Staff at the TESAC on March 6th and 7th, several individuals who came to the TESAC that 1st weekend (16 on March 6th and 35 on March 7th), were turned away as there was no room there or at the IRC. When this was reported to our Executive Director and Board over that first weekend, with no response or resolution from our Community Partners as of yet, our Executive and Board decided to reopen the 850 Ouellette location that Sunday evening, while a solution was found to allow everyone a place to go when

they reported to the TESAC for shelter. This caused quite a bit of an uproar unfortunately with our Mayor's Office as was reported in several Media Outlets, so once we ensured EVERYONE who came to the TESAC would be sheltered (Tuesday, March 9th), we shut down operations at 850 Ouellette. The Mission continues to work with the Health Unit and the City of Windsor to come up with a plan to safely reopen our 664 Victoria and 875 Ouellette locations to shelter and feed those who come to us. Our plan and hope, is to have our Essential Services back up and running fully with additional safety precautions in place by the end of March.

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## Volunteering at the Mission During a Pandemic

As has always been the case, Volunteers are the lifeblood of the Downtown Mission. Staff and Guests have missed seeing so many of our regular Volunteers over the past year, but we continue to see many of them as they help in different and we look forward to seeing more of them once we can have more Volunteers back with us safely. At this time, we want to highlight a few of our amazing Volunteers, who have been and continue to be a vital part of our Family!

First we have DJ Vandongen who's been a valued member of the Mission's Development Team for the past 2 years. After moving back to Windsor and being semi-retired, DJ was happy to find a Volunteer Opportunity with the Downtown Mission. She has enjoyed helping out at Reception and taking pictures at the Mission's Annual Mission Ride. During the Pandemic, DJ has been keeping updated on Mission life via Social Media and keeping in contact with Mission Staff. DJ "hopes to get back soon to fully support the DTM in person but is sending well wishes as work continues to offer the services and supports for those who come to the Mission daily."

Next meet Matthew Isherwood, who's volunteered in the Mission Kitchen since April 2016. Pre-COVID, he would often be found amidst our Kitchen Staff and Volunteers, cheerfully helping prep and serve food and cleaning dishes. During the Pandemic, Matthew's been staying in touch with Staff and following the Mission on Social Media. Once things clear up, Matthew hopes to return to the Mission's Kitchen where he looks forward to working alongside amazing Staff and Volunteers who help feed those who are hungry every day. Though it's been a challenging year, Matthew wants to remind us all that we should "stay positive and that this too shall pass!"

He hopes the Mission will be able to continue serving those in need, through the Pandemic and beyond.

Kate Fairbairn volunteered with the Mission for 6 months pre-Covid, helping serve dinner to our Guests. During the past year, Kate has remained connected with the Mission and her Volunteering by coming in and helping with a deep clean of the kitchen when needed. She's also very graciously dropped off coffees to the Kitchen Staff to show her support and to stay in touch with her Mission Family. Kate hopes to return soon. She states, "The Staff and Guests of the Mission have made me feel so welcomed. The Mission is a Family and I feel like I'm a party of that Family!" Kate hopes that during the remainder of 2021, that all Volunteers will be able to safely get back to helping those who come to the Mission and that the Mission will continue to take care of our region's most vulnerable individuals and families.

Another Volunteer who has been a staple at the Mission since she started with us in 2015 is Julienne Rousseau. Julie started volunteering in the Mission's Kitchen when she was looking for a way to learn about the effects of poverty on her community. During the Pandemic, Julie has volunteered when needed, to ensure that the Mission could continue to serve 3 meals a day to the hundreds of hurting individuals coming in for meals. When she's off, she stays connected with Staff and Volunteers to be a support in any way possible as she's noticed a heighted level of stress amidst Staff, Volunteers and Guests due to the Pandemic. She has also held a few Virtual Fundraisers with her Avon Business, to help raise much-needed funds to support the operations of the Mission. Julie shares, "My hope is that the City of Windsor and all residents who can afford to help,

will make donations or come down to the front lines and join us as Volunteers."

Lastly, we'd like to introduce CityThrive, a Project of Enactus Windsor from the University of Windsor. CityThrive's students have been volunteering with the Mission for the past two years and works with the Mission's Enterprise Program, to teach and develop skills which will help Enterprise Trainees return to the workforce. These Students have helped many of our Enterprise Trainees with Resume and Cover Letter writing, Interview Prep and Job Searches as well. Jordyn Tocco shares, "The skills and values learned through the Enterprise program will stick with you for life. The opportunity to work with such inspiring and hardworking people is one I'll be forever grateful for. Incredibly, people on both sides of the program can grow together." During the past year, CityThrive changed the delivery of their work to a virtual format to work within safety protocols and continued to be a vital part of our Mission Team. They look forward to continuing to work virtually with the Mission in the coming year as we try to work back to the way things were pre-Covid.

Regardless of whether Volunteers who are part of the Mission Family continue to volunteer in person, help serve our Guests virtually, check in with our Staff and Volunteers or help advocate and raise funds to help the Mission continue operating through these difficult times, they are all cherished and appreciated! The Mission wouldn't be able to make the serve those who need us most each year and create the impact we do on our community, without our Volunteers. So if you haven't heard it in a while, "Thank You, we love you and we can't wait to see you again soon!"



## Making Lemonade on the Coldest Night of the Year!



When the world hands you lemons, what do we do here in Windsor-Essex? We make lemonade of course! And plenty of it, to help MANY more thirsty individuals than we had hoped to with lemons!

This is a very simple analogy to help show what we as Windsor-Essex, came together to do for this year's Coldest Night of the Year Walk on Feb. 20th. The Coldest Night of the Year Walk is a National Fundraiser to help provide food, shelter and hope to those who need it the most in communities across Canada. Here in Windsor-Essex, the Downtown Mission has been hosting this Event locally for the past 9 years and it's the Mission's biggest Annual Fundraising Event.

This year was no different, as we'd started planning for CNOY 2021 last year, we'd hoped to have more Teams and Walkers join us to help us raise even more funds to provide the Mission's services to those who are hungry, homeless and hurting as we've seen more and more individuals come to the Mission each year for help. However, approximately a month before Event Day, the Province of Ontario went into Lockdown due to Covid numbers and in trying to do our part, we reluctantly decided to switch

our Event to a 100% Virtual Event, to keep everyone safe and give people the opportunity to participate in any way they felt comfortable to do so. We weren't sure how this would work out for the Mission as this was our first fully Virtual Event, but were we in for a pleasant surprise!

Although we had less Teams and Walkers signed up, our amazing community rallied together to surpass every financial goal we had set, amended and amended again! As of Feb. 20th when we had approximately 50 Walkers join us for a Virtual Opening Ceremony through Zoom as they began their walks or were finishing their walks, we had 201 Walkers Signed up with 31 Teams and we'd raised \$84,412. Our goal for this Event was \$70,000, so we were SOOO pleased to see this not only reached but surpassed, on a very difficult year for all of us! And guess what, a month after the Event, our numbers keep growing as the official cut-off is March 31st. We are currently at 208 Walkers with \$94,347 raised!!!
