Welcome Home



When asked why he came to the Mission in September 2021 Matthew replied, "it was a good place to start!" Matthew was in a very bad situation, he was homeless, on probation, and had been evicted from his apartment. He met with Brittany Lavin, Programs and Services Manager, and began a positive journey that has led to many positive changes in his life.

"Brittany helped get me in the Sanctuary Program (over night shelter) and coordinated with CMHA to meet with a case worker. I also see a nurse practitioner at Street Health," Matt explained. With his health needs being met and a safe place to sleep, Matt was able to focus on his personal wellness and regain control of his life. Throughout the journey the Downtown Mission walked with him offering support and encouragement. "They helped me remain positive, focus on my goals and helped me keep my appointments," Matt said. His road forward was not without some challenges. Despite being fully vaccinated Matt tested positive for COVID. During the pandemic he took advantage of the COVID testing

at the Mission and was surprised by his positive test result. Although he had no symptoms, he had to be quarantined safely in the Isolation and Recovery Centre.

"I understand why I was there," Matt said, "but I felt like I was being punished." The DTM's staff maintained regular contact with Matt and reassured him that he could return to the Mission once he was COVID free.

"They helped keep the experience positive. Checking up on me showed me they cared," he said.

Matt also registered with the DTM's Housing First Program and is looking forward to March 15th with great anticipation. On this date Matt will be leaving the Sanctuary and will be moving into his own apartment!

He is very excited and looking forward to the next phase of his life. Matt plans to be a DTM volunteer to assist others living in difficult circumstances and walked in his shoes and be a testament to the power of the Mission.

WYC Welcomes New Program Manager

The Windsor Youth Centre Program has a new Program Manager as of March 1, 2022. Ashley Marchand has taken on the program's leadership upon the retirement of Donna Roy who will be greatly missed.

Ashley began her career as a student at the WYC in 2013 and was hired on as the Youth Program Facilitator upon graduation from St. Clair College's Child Youth Worker Program in 2014.

Ashley has acquired a great deal of frontline experience and is ready for the challenges of the Program Manager position. She has worked as a WYC outreach worker and volunteer coordinator. "We help provide our youth with general needs help. I do a lot of 1-to-1 support, assisting with housing and tenant rights as well as screening and training volunteers," said Ashley.

Ashley has set some priorities to accomplish going forward in her new role. "Better access to mental health services and sustainable affordable housing are important objectives to help support our youth, along with life-skills training. These issues will be an important focus for the WYC."

With the COVID restrictions beginning to ease Ashley and her team look forward to welcoming youth guests back and opening the facility. "Our ability to meet face-to-face with our youth was limited during COVID. Many of our

interactions had to be virtual. Being able to speak with a staff member in person is vital to the services we provide," explained Ashley.

With 40 to 60 young people dropping in on any given day, Ashley knows that WYC is an important resource to assist youth experiencing crisis in their lives. "We have a great team of support staff and volunteers. Coming from the frontline, I understand the needs of our youth and adapting to meet their needs. We are a motivated and hard-working group of staff and volunteers and will keep working together to help our youth and the vulnerable population we serve achieve their goals," said Ashley.

DTM and City of Windsor Unite



In February, Windsor and Essex County experiences its coldest days and nights of the winter season.

Exceptionally cold weather creates additional hardship for homeless people and people living in poverty, by putting them at risk of illness, frostbite or even death because of exposure to the frigid elements. The Downtown Mission partnered with the City of Windsor to provide a warming centre during the day and evening in addition to its emergency shelter for people needing overnight accommodation.

The City of Windsor provided the additional funding from the Provincial Social Services Relief Fund. This supplementary overnight space assisted in alleviating capacity pressures in the emergency shelter system. It will remain in place while shelters are full.

The system has been planning for the onset of cold weather and providing comfort stations for people experiencing homelessness since the fall. This initiative was actioned in response to demands placed on the system due to COVID requirements and the cold weather. The Health Unit was also consulted to ensure all public health protocols associated with COVID were met.

"With the extreme weather conditions many hurting people were looking for a place to get out of the cold, even for a few hours. No one needs to risk being on the streets when we are experiencing extreme weather conditions, Providing that safe place is core to our being," said Rukshini Ponniah-Goulin, Interim Executive Director.

Coldest Night of the Year 2022

This year's Coldest Night of the Year was a Virtual Event due to COVID restrictions for the second year. Yet, the support for this event continues to be strong and participation remains high with many in our community getting involved as always to raise awareness and funds for the hungry, homeless and hurting in our community! The Mission has been hosting this Event in Windsor-Essex for 11 out of the 12 years that the Event has been running nationally and we were pleased to be one of 165 cities across the country showing our hurting neighbours we care and they are not alone through our participation in this very popular Event. Together we have helped raise over \$11,000,000 to help local service organizations provide supports to individuals experiencing homelessness this year!

The Event's Lead Sponsor, Ground Effects Ltd helped create a momentum early on in the planning for the Mission's largest Annual Event and with it, we had 29 Teams and 193 join in and participate at whatever level of comfort they had with walking for the common cause. The Virtual Opening Ceremonies began at 5:00 pm on Saturday, February 26th and walkers participated over Zoom in celebrating the work of The Downtown Mission and the engagement and successes of the Event's Participants. At the Opening Ceremonies, a total of \$86,897 had been raised which had increased as of the next day to over \$91,000.

The Top 3 Fundraising Teams celebrated at our Opening Ceremonies were: 1. Mission Possible (DTM Board), 2. HUCsters (Harrow United Church) and 3. TD Bank Windsor-Essex. Our Top 3 Individual Fundraisers at the time were: 1. Kristie M, 2. Tracy M and 3. Abram B.

Over the last few months, we have seen an increase in the number of men, women and families coming

encountering lineups of people Ave to 875 Ouellette Ave. This will who've never had to use a Food Bank centralize all our adult Programs and before. We've also seen an uptick of Services for in one building, allowing individuals coming to our Dining for better service, security and Hall, to get a warm meal but also a warm place to be during these cold winter months. Homeless people community, we will reminisce and begin to queue before 5 pm, so they will have a bed for the night on our Overnight Shelter.
